GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. Competition in school fair activities is open to residents and students of the Ithaca School District, Ithaca School Alumni, parents/guardians and siblings of students attending the Ithaca School District, and employees of the Ithaca School District.

Junior Division: Preschool through grade 12.

Open Class: 18 years of age and over and not a current student of the Ithaca School District

2. An exhibitor may enter in as many classes as he or she desires, but is only allowed **one entry per person per class.**

3. All entry forms (animals and otherwise, but not horse show) must be in to the school office by 3:30 PM, Friday, September 22, 2017.

4. Exhibits will be received in the gym area from **1:30 PM to 6:30 PM** Friday, September 29, 2017. Exhibit tags will be available in the commons area. Please attach the proper tag to the correct entry.

5. Those exhibiting animals must pick-up entry tickets and back tags on Friday, September 29 in the Commons and the animal should be brought to the show area by the outdoor basketball court near the bus parking lot by 7:30 AM Saturday morning of the school fair, September 30.

6. All exhibits need to be managed by or be the property of the exhibitor for a minimum of 60 days before the show. Failure to prove ownership to fair officials will result in the exhibit being disqualified and, if applicable, the animal will not be allowed to be sold at the Meat Animal, Cheese, & Butter auction.

7. Exhibitors are responsible for the care and safety of their exhibits. The Fair Management is not responsible or liable for any accidents or losses during Entry Day or Fair Day.

8. The right is reserved to open any Canning exhibits if necessary.

9. Participants showing animals must be present during judging.

10. Awards will be made in each class by a qualified judge.

11. Ribbons will be awarded in Dept. A, B, C, D, and E. In all other departments, if the entry is worthy of award, stickers will be used to place items 1st (blue), 2nd (red), or 3rd (white). If the entries are not worthy of awards, no premiums will be given. You may request a ribbon(s) from the fair clerk when picking up premium money. Number of ribbons allowed per exhibitor is up to the discretion of the fair clerk.

12. Decisions of the judges will be final.

13. Each exhibitor may sell only one animal of their choice. Exhibitors must show their sale animal in a showmanship class to be eligible for the meat animal sale. **Only animals shown in a market class will be eligible for the sale and all auction animals must be checked on the entry form.**

a. Commission Statement: All participants selling animals that sell for less than \$250 will pay a \$10.00 fee and all participants who have animals that sell for over \$250 will pay 6% of the total sale of that animal.

14. Any rules that the Fair Management sees fit to be made on or before the day of the fair shall be observed by all exhibitors and anyone else that it may concern.

15. Violation of the above rules may result in forfeiture of premium money.

All gym exhibits must remain in place until 3:00 PM Fair Day. Premium money may be picked up in the gym between 3:00 and 4:00 PM. If you are unable to pick up your premiums at this time, you may pick them up in the school office the following Monday.

ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

CATTLE

Cattle showing any symptoms of a contagious disease will not be permitted to be exhibited at the discretion of superintendent of the department. Cattle must be in good health to be exhibited, shown, and sold.

SWINE

Swine showing any symptoms of a contagious disease will not be permitted to be exhibited at the discretion of superintendent of the department. Pigs must be in good health to be exhibited, shown, and sold. Returning hogs to your farm will be at your own risk and the Ithaca Fair and School District will not be liable for any contagious disease(s) spread to your farm.

SHEEP

Sheep showing febrile symptoms of any contagious or infectious disease will not be permitted to be exhibited.

POULTRY

No fowl of any type or class showing any symptoms of a contagious or infectious disease may be exhibited. All fowl exhibited may be subject to quarantine and slaughter if any infectious or contagious disease is discovered among any of the fowl in the exhibit.

FUR BEARING ANIMALS

Rabbits and other fur bearing animals showing any evidence of disease cannot be exhibited.
